## The Lord's Prayer "Amen."

"But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord." ~ James 1:6-7

What's the point of prayer if we don't believe that God will do it? Our Lord said, "*Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.*" (Mk 11:24) Do you believe that? Or is prayer simply wishful thinking? Where is our confidence when it comes to prayer?

Luther teaches in his Catechism,

"This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen means 'yes, yes, it shall be so.""

The certainty of prayer rests on the command and the promise of Jesus. He commanded us when He gave us the  $2^{nd}$  Commandment and when He taught us the Our Father:

"when you pray, say..." (Lk 11:1-2);

"You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God."

While we have a duty to pray, there's also a promise. As St. Bernard of Clairvaux once said, "God gives us whatever we ask for in prayer, or better." And the Psalms say, "Call upon Me in the day of trouble and I will deliver you" (Ps 50:15).

Between these two – command and promise – we have plenty of reason to pray. We're both prodded by the command and invited by the Gospel. What's more, He even provides the very words for us to pray and joins us in the prayer. So, when we pray the Lord's Prayer, we may be confident that what we ask is pleasing to our Father in heaven and heard by Him. Such confidence is faith in the promise and faithful obedience to the command. Without this confidence, there is no prayer, and, as St. James says,

"the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord." (James 1:6-7)

To mark this confidence – this faith – our Lord has also given us a word to confess: "*Amen.*" "*Amen*" means much more than "*the end,*" even if that's how we end our prayers. But why? What is this word '*Amen*'?

Amen is actually a Hebrew word, which means 'belief' or 'truth'. Amen is the word of bold confession, the voice of confidence, the "*yes, yes, it shall be so*!" In fact, Luther says,

"But all depends upon this, that we learn also to say 'Amen."" (Large Catechism, III.119)

'*Amen'* is what faith is given to say. It's the word that clings to the promise, despite what the eyes see or experience has

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shown. And 'amen' is *our* word, *your* word. Every time a blessing is bestowed: "*Amen!*" Every time gifts are given: "*Amen!*" Every true confession or just verdict: "*Amen!*" When you kneel at the altar and hear "*This is My Body...This is My Blood*": "*Amen!*" When a child is baptized into the name of the Holy Trinity: "*Amen!*" When sins are forgiven: "*Amen!*" When the Psalms are prayed and glory is given to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: "*Amen!*" When prayer is offered according to our Lord's command and promise: "*Amen!*" When we confess the creed and even our own sins: "*Amen!*" Wherever our Lord's word and work are true, and His gifts are given according to His promise: "*Amen!* Amen!"

This is *your* word! Don't be so shy to use it! Confess and confess boldly: "*Yes, yes, it shall be so*!" Our 'amen' is like the Blessed Virgin Mary, who at the promise of the Angel said,

"Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." (Lk 1:38)

As Martin Chemnitz said,

"By this word 'amen,' faith shows itself not to doubt or to be carried about with the waves of mistrust. Faith does not doubt whether God will hear us and will do those things for which we ask. Instead, it strongly confesses that as God has commanded us to ask and has promised that he will hear, so he will faithfully perform and accomplish our requests. Again, by this word, faith stirs up itself, upholds, defends, and confirms itself against doubting." (Chemnitz, 103)

'Amen' is, as St. Jerome said, "*The seal of prayer*." It's our confession of faith and rejection of doubt. It's holding God to His word and not letting Him be any other God than He has promised to be. It confirms the truth and rejects the lie. It receives the gifts and looks for more to come.

But be careful not to lend your 'Amen' to lies or to prayers that can't find their promise or command in Christ. Don't give your 'amen' to false confessions, false lives, false promises, or threats. Pay attention to what is prayed, taught, and lived; and give your 'amen' accordingly. It is, after all, the word of confidence, of *faith*. So it is the word we're given to confess before Christ and Him alone. As St. Paul says,

"For all the promises of God find their Yes in him. That is why it is through him that we utter our Amen to God for his glory." (2 Cor 1:20).

Jesus is the '*Amen*.' He is faith and truth and the embodiment of confidence before the Father. His 'amen' is now our 'amen,' just as His Father has become "*Our Father*..."

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## DIVING DEEPER INTO CHRIST'S GIFTS

#### FROM OUR CONFESSIONS

The Large Catechism by Martin Luther

As the head of the family should teach them in a simple way to his household.

#### THE APOSTLES' CREED

#### Article I.

17] Moreover, we also confess that God the Father has not only given us all that we have and see before our eyes, but daily preserves and defends us against all evil and misfortune, averts all sorts of danger and calamity; and that He does all this out of pure love and goodness, without our merit, as a benevolent Father, who cares for us that no evil befall us. 18] But to speak more of this belongs in the other two parts of this article, where we say: Father Almighty.

19] Now, since all that we possess, and, moreover, whatever, in addition, is in heaven and upon the earth, is daily given, preserved, and kept for us by God, it is readily inferred and concluded that it is our duty to love, praise, and thank Him for it without ceasing, and, in short, to serve Him with all these things, as He demands and has enjoined in the Ten Commandments. 20] Here we could say much if we were to expatiate, how few there are that believe this article. For we all pass over it, hear it and say it, but neither see nor consider what the words teach us.

21] For if we believed it with the heart, we would also act accordingly, and not stalk about proudly, act defiantly, and boast as though we had life, riches, power, and honor, etc., of ourselves, so that others must fear and serve us, as is the practise of the wretched, perverse world, which is drowned in blindness, and abuses all the good things and gifts of God only for its own pride, avarice, lust, and luxury, and never once regards God, so as to thank Him or acknowledge Him as Lord and Creator.

22] Therefore, this article ought to humble and terrify us all, if we believed it. For we sin daily with eyes, ears, hands, body and soul, money and possessions, and with everything we have, especially those who even fight against the Word of God. Yet Christians have this advantage, that they acknowledge themselves in duty bound to serve God for all these things, and to be obedient to Him [which the world knows not how to do].


23] We ought, therefore, daily to practise this article, impress it upon our mind, and to remember it in all that meets our eyes, and in all good that falls to our lot, and wherever we escape from calamity or danger, that it is God who gives and does all these things, that therein we sense and see His Paternal heart and his transcendent love toward us. Thereby the heart would be warmed and kindled to be thankful, and to employ all such good things to the honor and praise of God.

24] Thus we have most briefly presented the meaning of this article, as much as is at first necessary for the most simple to learn, both as to what we have and receive from God, and what we owe in return, which is a most excellent knowledge, but a far greater treasure. For here we see how the Father has given Himself to us, together with all creatures, and has most richly provided for us in this life, besides that He has overwhelmed us with unspeakable, eternal treasures by His Son and the Holy Ghost, as we shall hear. *Continued next month... #### THRIVENT ACTION TEAMS

#### How it works:

Christmas is coming. It is a joyous time of feasting. The Church feasts upon the Word of God in sermon, song, and sacrament.

We hear the proclamation of the message of the angels: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). We mingle our voices with theirs as we sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased" (Luke 2:14)! We receive the proclaimed Savior, Christ the Lord, not wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in manger but wrapped in bread and wine placed into our mouths for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We feast in great joy indeed because of this great blessing from our Lord and God.

God's people in ancient Israel also feasted with great joy. The Lord showered His abundant blessing on His people. And He commanded them to feast upon it (Deuteronomy 16). The people were to go to the place appointed, where the Lord would make His name dwell, and give offerings, each man as he was able, according to the blessing of the Lord that He had given them (Deut. 16:10, 15, 17).

And there the Lord would bless them with joy as they feasted upon what the Lord had provided. They ate of the choice parts of their offerings. They enjoyed the company of all the people of God as they together heard His promises of blessing, sang of His bountiful goodness, and partook of what He gave.

We feast on the Word who became flesh to dwell among us, not just during Christmas but throughout all the year. We feast not just on the salvation He has wrought for us in His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, but we feast also on all the temporal blessings that God gives out of His fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in us. We enjoy the rich bounty that God provides, not only in Word and Sacrament, but also in house and home, property and income, family and friends.

Let us then, as did our brothers in the faith from ancient Israel, give as we are able, according to the blessing of the Lord our God that He has given us. Let us, like them, give generously of the first fruits of our income, which He gives, so that all may know and enjoy the salvation He gives and the joy we have in the Savior born in the city of David, who is Christ the Lord.
