## Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #14

**<u>COPPER RIVER DISTRICT</u>**: The Copper River District will open at 7:00 am on Monday, June 14 for a 12hour commercial drift gillnet fishing period. Waters within the **<u>expanded</u>** Chinook salmon inside closure area will be <u>**CLOSED**</u> during this period (Map 1). Increasing daily passage at the Miles Lake sonar station indicates that the inriver goal is likely to be met and supports opening the Copper River District commercial fishery.

During the commercial fishing season, subsistence harvest may occur in the Copper River District concurrent in time and area with commercial fishing periods until the Copper River District is closed at the end of the season. Additionally, waters of the Copper River District, excluding the expanded Chinook salmon inside closure area (Map 1), will open to subsistence fishing from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm on all Saturdays between May 25 and October 31.

The **<u>expanded</u>** Chinook salmon inside closure area will be defined as waters north of a line connecting the following points (bold font is for points not defined in regulation):

\*Please note that the 'Coffee Creek West' point was replaced with 'Chinook Alternate #1'.

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing <u>during all periods</u>.

Subsistence users may obtain subsistence permits during regular business hours. Prince William Sound Management Area salmon subsistence permits may be obtained through any ADF&G office or online (https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Store/). In Cordova, permits will be available during normal business hours Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. ADF&G staff will not be available to issue permits before hours, after hours, on state holidays, or on weekends. Permit holders are 907-424-3212 encouraged call the Cordova office to at or report online (https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/) to provide preliminary harvest reports to assist with inseason harvest tracking.

Cumulative sonar count through 6/11 is 279,049 fish, whereas 276,211 fish are projected by this date to meet the Inriver Run Goal. The 0600 count for 6/12 is 2,431 fish. The Prince William Sound Science Center's Lower Copper River Sonar Station is operational near the mouth of Clear Martin River on the lower east side of the Copper River (60° 22.48' N., 144° 53.68' W.) and fish passage summaries can be viewed at <u>https://pwssc.org/2021-lower-coppersonar/</u>.

**BERING RIVER DISTRICT:** The Bering River District will remain closed to commercial fishing.

**COGHILL DISTRICT:** The Coghill District, excluding the Esther and Granite Bay subdistricts and the Wally Noerenberg Hatchery (WNH) THA and SHA, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 24-hour fishing period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 14. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Thursday, June 10 were 4,100 chum and 500 sockeye salmon with 105 deliveries reported. The Coghill River weir was fish tight as of yesterday morning and 0 sockeye salmon have passed the weir as of this morning.

PWSAC requests that the Esther Subdistrict, the Granite Bay Subdistrict, and the WNH SHA and THA remain closed for the entirety of the 24-hour commercial fishing period commencing on Monday, June 14. Cost recovery fishing has started at WNH and will continue as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

**ESHAMY DISTRICT:** The Eshamy District, excluding the Main Bay Subdistrict and Main Bay Hatchery (MBH) THA, SHA, and AGZ, will open to commercial gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 14. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 24-hour period that started on Thursday, June 10 were 4,800 chum and 1,400 sockeye salmon with 105 deliveries reported.

PWSAC requests that the Main Bay Subdistrict remain closed for the entirety of the 24-hour commercial fishing period commencing on Monday, June 14. Cost recovery harvests will commence at MBH as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

**MONTAGUE DISTRICT**: The Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **east of Channel Island, north of a line from 60° 9.52'N., 147° 22.38'W. to 60° 14.25'N., 147° 23.11'W, and east of a line from 60° 14.58'N., 147° 22.22'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147°14.30'W.,** will open to purse seine fishing for 48 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 14 with additional 36-hour periods at 8:00 am on Thursday, June 17, and 8:00 am on Saturday June 19. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice.** A total of 320,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to Port Chalmers. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that ended on Friday, June 11 was 6,560 chum salmon with 17 deliveries reported. Contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 9 was 55% WNH, 23% Port Chalmers, 11% AFK and 11% wild.



**SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT:** The AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will open to purse seine fishing for 48 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 14 with additional 36-hour periods at 8:00 am on Thursday, June 17, and 8:00 am on Saturday June 19. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will not be in effect until further notice.** A total of 150,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to AFK.Hatchery. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that ended on Friday, June 11 was 7,279 chum salmon with 10 deliveries reported. Contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 9 was 67% AFK, 26% WNH, 2% Port Chalmers and 4% wild.
